The Dempsey Center More than just a tobacco policy update

Background and Approach:

Tobacco use is a leading cause of cancer. People who use tobacco products or who are regularly exposed to secondhand smoke have an increased risk of cancer. The chemicals in tobacco products and secondhand smoke increase the risk of cancer by damaging a cell's DNA, allowing for cancerous cells to be created and by weakening the body's immune system and its ability to control or kill cancer cells.

Founded in 2008, the Dempsey Center's mission is to make life better for people managing the impacts of cancer. They do this by providing free cancer support, education and complementary therapies to cancer patients, their families and caregivers from their locations in Lewiston and South Portland. In addition, the Dempsey Center has collaborated with Healthy Androscoggin to proactively provide awareness and education about the connection between tobacco and cancer. For the past ten years, the two organizations have worked together to offer high-quality, no-cost tobacco cessation programming to local area community members.

When the Dempsey Center determined they wanted to be more proactive with their own workplace tobacco policy, they reached out to Healthy Androscoggin for assistance. As a result, the Dempsey Center passed a stronger smoke- and tobacco-free policy effective April 1, 2021. The updated policy included information about quit resources and general enforcement and compliance expectations. Not only did they update their tobacco policy, they also took the opportunity to review and improve their drug-free workplace policy.
